#### **FAREWELL MRS SPENCER**

Mrs Spencer has served Marton School as the school secretary taking on the role part time in October 1995. Based on a maximum entry of 15 pupils starting Reception each academic year, Mrs Spencer has entered over 320 pupils in the official admissions log book.

Mrs Spencer has served 3 headteachers and seen a huge amount of change in the systems and protocols of running the school office.

Mrs Spencer particularly enjoys meeting new children as they arrive at the office to change their signature cards, helping them to use good manners and to share a little story. During Mr Gray's headship when the staff played an annual game of rounders against the Y6 children, she was a formidable opponent. In fact not one plucky salesman has ever managed to bypass her in an attempt to speak with the headteacher either.

Mrs Spencer is a keen painter and crafter and has often helped run craft, art and baking clubs notably helping with the amazing 3D Chinese artwork in the school hall. In her own spare time, Mrs Spencer paints beautiful acrylic paintings. As well as this, she is known as a keen gardener and as well as providing first hand advice for the school, helping with gardening club and helping to plant up the Millennium garden, she is a member of the horticultural society. Ordering all the gardening equipment through Amazon and online stores for the recent Polytunnel Project will be a defining memory for Mrs Ferris particularly. But she will agree it was definitely worth it!

As for ordering equipment, Mrs Spencer has helped ensure that resources have not been wasted – in fact she is known to keep a secret stash of pritt sticks and stationery, so that just when teachers thought they'd run out, Mrs Spencer would be able to provide. Of course, teachers know better than to go hunting for this themselves!

Mrs Spencer has an extensive general knowledge enjoying quiz nights, is a big Elton John fan and an amateur ballroom dancer. One of her passions is visiting stately homes which has included several visits to Buckingham Palace. Also known as a very keen traveller, Mrs Spencer will have more time for exotic holidays (at a cheaper rate in term time) with her husband and also more time to spend with her grandchildren.

Mrs Spencer will definitely be missed! From proof reading letters and reports to maintaining accounts for over 20 years and supporting school clubs and the life of this little school. 

# POLYTUNNEL NEWS

# OCTOBER 2017







We arrived back from the summer break to find the whole garden swamped with vegetables! The pumpkins and butternut squash had taken over half the outside garden; sweetcorn was abundant and runner beans were plentiful! Tomatoes, sweet peppers, chilli peppers, leeks and aubergine had excelled inside the polytunnel too. Thanks to everyone who has purchased our produce and given feedback — much appreciated. The children have enjoyed trying a huge variety of raw and cooked vegetables that they may have not tried before.

#### **Awards**

We have now achieved RHS level 3, 4 and 5 which provided us with £200 of gardening centre vouchers, £100 of seeds and free plug plants from Rocket Gardens. Our first batch, of 150 vegetables, arrived last week and have been planted by the children. More will arrive after Christmas and early summer. We look forward to trying different varieties of lettuce, cabbage, kale, spinach and lots more.

We also won £2000 in the Tesco Bags of Help scheme which will be used to provide outdoor sensory experiences for all the children. The garden area will be extended to include raised beds for the sensory plants.

## Hanging baskets/produce sales

Our little enterprise has had a very successful few months and provided Sapphire Class with funds to keep stocked up with compost, canes and other equipment. We remain self-sufficient and hope this continues in the years to come. We also purchased a small greenhouse where our Christmas potatoes, bulbs and seedlings are currently residing and doing very well. Pots of Spring bulbs, which have been potted will be ready for sale later in the year. Another purchase was the bird feeding station which the children enjoyed putting together. Just have to wait for the birds to find it now!

#### **Pallets**

Many thanks to everyone who brought pallets. Some have been turned into a cold frame and others were made into stands for the water butts and shelves. We also intend making raised beds for Alpines/succulents. The planned outdoor seating area hasn't progressed as we would have liked due to the lack of time needed to sand and paint the pallets. If anyone has a spare hour or two we would greatly appreciate your help.

We cannot believe how far we have come in our first year and we are hoping that our success continues. Hard work and enthusiasm certainly pays off! Well done Sapphire Gardeners...
